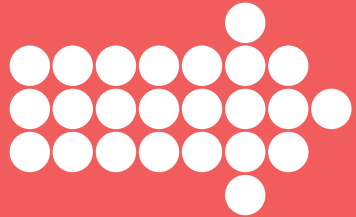

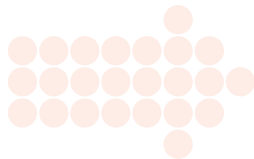

Central Youth Club has 240 members and opens Mon-Thursday 6.30-9.30pm with a 50p entrance fee. Facilities include a fitness centre, music room – with recording facility, a computer suite, sports hall, girls room, arts craft/TV lounge and a coffee bar. The club also has snooker, pool and table tennis tables and two astro turf football pitches. There is a youth exchange programme where club members get the chance to go to Spain. After school open access club for refugees and asylum seekers, Mon 10.00am-2.00pm and Thurs 3.30-5.30pm.

Recently installed a satellite system to enable all young people to see football matches on a large screen. Capoeira runs Mon, Wed, and Fri evenings.

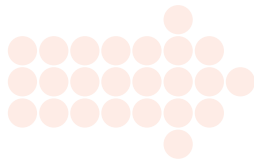
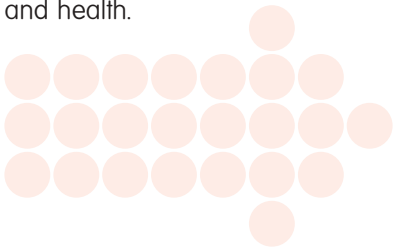
Prospects 2000+

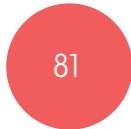
